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From the desk of CEO

FXB in India has now completed three years of its new entity as FXB India Suraksha as a registered not-for-profit company. Three years looks a short period but for us it was a long and eventful journey. The team of deeply motivated staff worked with beneficiaries at the ground level changing their lives, bringing up their confidence and training them to face the world with confidence towards a sustainable livelihood and better living. In this process FXB developed enormous experience and knowledge in the areas of health, education, nutrition, environment and water, sanitation and hygiene.

In 2009-2010, FXB Suraksha was able to directly reach 2763 children, 454 PLHAs, 315 MSMs and 82470 total beneficiaries through its various programmes. Five FXB-Villages enter their third and final year of operation this year. The model has proved to be of immense value in enriching the lives of the poor and vulnerable. In January 2010 we have started a new FXB-Village at Puducherry/ Villupuram in Tamil Nadu.

This Annual Report stands as a testimony to the work done by the members of the FXB family in India in the last year but also capturing the summary of the last three years work. We at FXB Suraksha focus our energies on addressing the root causes of poverty to secure the rights of the children to survive, grow, and to develop towards a sustainable future. In the coming years, we aim will be to expand our mandate to address the core issue of poverty and the rights of the children in particular. Our collaboration with the Harvard FXB Centre for the SAFE project for the children will help to demonstrate the model in India.

While I applaud the work done by the dedicated professionals at FXB Suraksha and looking forward to the new directions that will be undertaken in the coming year, I also feel this to be the appropriate time and place to acknowledge the continuous support, advice and guidance from Countess Albina whose heart is always with the children in India. Without the generous support from FXB International and Countess Albina we could not have achieved what we did in the last three years. I also take this opportunity to thank many other donors and partners who contributed generously to our effort and for the cause of the children.

Organization Overview

Our Vision:

To facilitate the eradication of poverty for vulnerable and marginalized children and their families through creation of an enabling physical and economic environment to lead their lives with self esteem, dignity and economic self sufficiency.

Who we are

We in FXB India Suraksha work for the rights of children affected by poverty and disease, especially those affected or infected by HIV/AIDS. We started operations in India since 1991 and the FXB India Suraksha has now completed three years registered as an Indian not-profit Section 25 company. The word 'Suraksha' (meaning 'security and protection') emphasizes our commitment to provide a security net to all children and for those specially affected and infected by disease and Poverty.

What we do

We are a result and action oriented field based organisation with a committed team of approximately 100 members and volunteers in 14 states across India directly working with the communities. We are a group of multi disciplined professionals dedicated and committed to the empowerment of women and children who are stigmatised and abandoned in society. Our specialisations and experiences range from environmental management to health, education, nutrition and psychosocial support. We build collective capacities of families to enable self-sufficiency through implementation of targeted interventions in health, nutrition, education, hygiene, sanitation and income generation, following the FXB-village model well tested in Africa and in some parts of Asia.







Presence & Reach





FXB India Suraksha has various programs spread across in fifteen states in India. Our core programme components are:



Nurturing healthy lives - Health & Nutrition

We facilitate access to basic medical care and health services for our beneficiaries through partnerships with local health facilities and hospitals. We promote intake of locally available grains and vegetables for better nutritional food habits. In addition, we ensure basic food security of families affected by AIDS through our nutrition support program.

Enduring Solutions - Education

We work to mainstream drop out school children back to regular schools, especially those affected or infected by HIV AIDS. Supplementary support through non-formal education and tuition classes is provided to facilitate the mainstreaming efforts. We conduct adult literacy classes for women to develop their self esteem, knowledge base and confidence.



Action against HIV - Prevention and awareness

We work to reduce stigma and discrimination through community mobilization and awareness generation camps. We provide basic care and support to people infected and affected with HIV/AIDS through quality referrals and regular follow ups for ART adherence. We work with infected peer leaders to train them as 'change agents' to promote prevention and understanding of HIV.

Strengthening Livelihoods - Income Generation & Savings

We work to strengthen the economic conditions of the vulnerable and marginalized families through capacity building and skill development. We provide them need based training and seed capital for small scale self help group based enterprises. These include animal husbandry, tailoring, jute and bamboo products manufacturing, fish drying, shop-keeping and other opportunities.



Securing clean environment - Water, Sanitation, & Environment

We believe that a good health and hygiene practise reduces nearly 50% of disease transmission. A good knowledge of hygiene and access to sanitation facilities is a must for basic good health. We work with the youth through a comprehensive communication strategy which includes training and awareness generation programs, street plays and linking up with government programs. In addition, we are also promoting maintenance of hand-pumps for safe water.

Building self esteem - Psychosocial Support

The majority of individuals in our intervention sites have experienced traumas and loss, and many are living with HIV. We provide psychosocial counselling sessions for individuals, families, and groups, to discuss issues such as stigma and discrimination, domestic problems, and overcoming despair.





INTEGRATED - COMPREHENSIVE - RESULT ORIENTED

The FXB-Village network is a sustainable and community-based solution to fight poverty and AIDS. Each FXB-Village brings improvements in health, education, and economic opportunity for 80 to 100 families in an impoverished and preferably HIV-affected area.

We don't provide charity. Instead, we equip individuals with the training and resources so they can achieve lasting selfsufficiency and stability.

Five of the villages - Vishakhapatnam, Imphal, Aizawl, Dhapa and Medinipur – having entered their third and the final year of intervention have shown remarkable achievements and enabled us to replicate the programme at Vellupuram in Tamil Nadu - Puducherry in January 2010. We have reached out to over 2000 beneficiaries in more than 400 families through the FXB-Village Network in 2009-2010.

Program impact:

- No HIV related stigma cases reported after our intervention due to the outreach and counseling services provided by FXB to the communities.
- No malnutrition cases reported in last one year among children in FXB program areas.
- More than 100 children successfully brought into mainstream education and over 500 children provided with educational support services.
- Over 170 adults and more than 25 children have shown continued ART adherence due to our regular follow ups and medical support services.
- Over 400 beneficiaries trained in various income generating activities through FXB training centres.



The FXB-Village Network Timeline

During the first years of the intervention, we actively support family and community efforts to fight the root causes of poverty. Initial support for education, health and nutrition are provided for a short period when their skills are being developed along with training for income generating activities. With increased self sufficiency the direct financial support decreases as income-generating activities expand, and families and communities are progressively able to sustain these costs themselves.

FXB-Village model is an empowering instrument with integrated approach that promotes ownership ensures sustainability and care for the children in their own community.











IGA in Focus

Sayamsidhha: New model of empowerment in an Urban Slum in West Bengal

The women of FXB-Village in Dhapa, West Bengal are actively engaged in the manufacture of jute products through a small production unit called Sayamsidhha. The unit makes a range of jute products like bags, folders, coasters, mats and hammocks which are unique in their design, eco-friendly material and customization. This has helped in increase of income and in improving the basic quality of lifestyle for the women involved. The unit also participated in the 2009 trade fair organised in Kolkata.

Inclusive & Integrated Development Program

PRO POOR - COMMUNITY & CONVERGENCE BASED

The Inclusive and Integrated Development Program was initiated in October, 2009 at Chepaluppada village in Visakhapatnam to promote comprehensive social, economic and environmental development of marginalised, poor and vulnerable communities.

The programme reaches out to over 400 families facilitating access to hygiene and sanitation, health, education, nutrition and income generation support.

Program Highlights:

- We promote developing self help groups and entrepreneurial capacity amongst women and vulnerable groups through facilitating access to skill building and seed capital.
- We provide a learning environment, equitable access to education and skills to women and children to capacitate them to build a better life.
- We provide basic medical services and health and hygiene education to women and children.
- We have established strong referral linkages with the existing government managed health facilities
- We facilitate improvement in sanitation conditions with help of other NGOs and linking with government programmes on sanitation





Story of Change

Behind the rattling wheels

Tauquir from Gwalior was forced by destiny to make Jaipur railway station his home. He was orphaned at eight and forced to live with his uncle who forced child labour on him. He escaped to Jaipur where he was discovered living on the railway station in a pitiable state by FXB Suraksha

He was brought to our programme centre and given shelter, medical and nutritional support and above all the love and care that every eight year old craves for.

Today, Tauquir visits the centre regularly and says that FXB Suraksha has helped him find his place in the world and aims to complete his studies and lead a more empowered life.

Initiative in Focus

FXB Computer Centre

FXB India Suraksha runs a Computer training centre for the benefit of the youth who are deprived of access to computers due to low education and financial status. The centre received a donation of nine brand new computers which enabled computer education for 38 youths. As a result, 14 of the students got well-paying jobs.









Railway Children Project

SHELTERING THE HOMELESS

Railway stations often become the shelter for many run-away children. Usually they run away from home due to abuse and negligence. Such children are vulnerable to disease, violence and sexual abuse and are in particular likely to be infected by HIV and related diseases.

FXB Suraksha facilitates access to counselling, basic health, shelter, recreation and other support services for the children directly or by linking them with other service providers.

In 2009 we reached out to over 190 children in the age group 5 to 16 years at the Jaipur railway station in Rajasthan.

Program impact:

- Facilitated access to shelter homes and drug deaddiction centres for 90% of the children at Jaipur Railway Station.
- Provided Intensive counselling for safe behaviour practices and de-addiction of children from substance abuse.
- A core committee for the protection and care of railway children has been constituted through FXB's advocacy initiatives. It comprises of Railway Protection Force (RPF), Station Master and other Railway Officials.













Uppada Fish Delights:

Innovating Indigenous resource use in Andhra Pradesh

A self help group with 10 local women was formed by FXB Suraksha with the name of 'Uppada Fish Delights'. These women were trained in fish drying and packaging with the help of Central Institute of Fisheries Technology (CIFT). The enterprise has gained immense popularity for its hygienic packaging and use of indigenous resources. Of the total capital cost for setting up the dry fish unit (1 tonne/month capacity) about 23% is contributed by the community. The Delight Sea Foods Agency has come forward to market the group products in the entire Andhra Pradesh. The net profit per member is estimated to be about Rs 3500 per month. Though the program had started with 10 women, already another 68 women from these villages have expressed their interest in taking up the activity. Initial estimates reveal that the plant will reach its breakeven point by end of this year.









Care & Support to People Living with HIV/AIDs (PLHAs)

NURTURING LIVES BEYOND HIV/AIDS

People living with HIV/AIDS (PLHAS) are often found to be living without knowledge of their status or medical support. Our work has been improving the quality of life & prolonged the life span of over 450 PLHAs through Medical support services in Vishakhapatnam, Mumbai, Calicut and the Indo-Myanmar border town of Moreh in Manipur.

Program impact:

- 100% ART adherence in over 130 PLHAs who were facilitated access to ART treatment and enabled adherence through regular follow up.
- Over 300 PLHAS received medical treatment for general ailment and cost of related testing partly covered like kidney liver function tests, Hemogram and CD4 testing.
- FXB community sensitization initiatives have ensured basic rights like stigma free life for PLHAs by increasing community participation in caring for them.

New Initiative: Medical Insurance for the HIV Positive

Medical insurance for HIV positive people is a new initiative by FXB Suraksha through which 116 PLHAs are enrolled under STAR Health Insurance scheme. Cover of up to Rs 30000 towards hospitalization charges is given to PLHAs with a CD4 count of 300 cells/mm3. For the same, CD4 screening camps were also organised. This initiative will go a long way for empowering those who are HIV positive.

Care & Support to Orphan & Valnerable Children (OVC)

ENABLING ACCESS TO BASIC RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

Our programme reintegrates Orphan and Vulnerable children (OVC) with the mainstream development process through health, psychosocial, nutritional and educational support. We work with over 2200 OVCs in Goa, Patna, Itanagar, Kohima, Vishakhapatnam and Calicut.

Program impact:

- Over 500 children attending school regularly with FXB support are showing marked improvement in grades.
- Extremely low school drop-out rate in FXB programme areas
- Over 850 children ensured at least one full meal with nutritional supplements every day through FXB Day-care centres.
- Regular health checkups and first aid medicines availed by over 500 OVCs.





Initiative in Focus: FXB Creche & Day-Care Centres

FXB India Suraksha runs four crèche centres at Nyukum Lapang Village Itanagar and a day care centre at AG Colony in Kohima. It is primarily for children in the age group 0-6 years that have working or ailing mothers. They provide the children with care, guidance and supervision in the absence of their mothers. These are operational since July 2009.

Slam Intervention

BEGINNING OF A NEW LIFE

Majority of the residents in urban slums are migrants in search of better livelihood opportunities from neighbouring poor and rural areas. The core objective of this programme is to generate awareness and access to health care services in order to effectively prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS, STIs and TB. Low education levels, high-risk behaviour, overflowing drainages, scarce supply of potable water and few public toilets for a large population are few of the problems faced in Slums that FXB Suraksha aims to address

We are reaching out to over 1500 beneficiaries from slums at Sanjay Camp in New Delhi and Ranchi in Jharkhand.

Program impact:

Provided gyneocologist's consultation to more than 500 women through health camps and linked pregnant women with local hospitals for antenatal checkups and institutional deliveries.


15 adolescent peer groups with over 200 members are trained to spread information on STI and AIDS.

> 48 youths given computer education and training for making them better equipped and qualified for jobs. 13 of these trained youth got immediate employment and are earning livelihood for their families

French Ambassador's visits to Sanjay Camp Slum in Chanakyapuri, New delhi

His Excellency Ambassador of France to India Mr. Jérôme Bonnafont and his delegation visited our Slum Intervention Program at Sanjay Camp Slum in New Delhi in March, 2010. The youth from FXB Computer Centre made a PowerPoint Presentation on environment and HIV/AIDS while the children performed a street play on Drug abuse for the Ambassador.





WORKING WITH HIGH RISK GROUPS

Men having Sex with Men (MSM) are highly vulnerable to HIV and AIDS infection. FXB Suraksha is the first NGO to initiate working with this group in Mizoram. The main objective of the project is to prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS and STI/STD among MSMs through intensive targeted interventions.

We are supporting over 300 identified MSMs with medicines and counselling services in Dawrpui West in Aizawl, Mizoram

Program impact:

- Over 300 MSMs counselled on safe sex practices and educated on the benefits of using condoms
- Almost 20 MSMs trained as per educators for providing regular counselling and support at drop-in centres.
- 87 suspected cases of HIV and STI infections referred to hospitals and health care clinics.

Initiative in Focus: 1097- Toll Free Telephone Counselling

Telephone counselling is a popular service is Mizoram which provides information on HIV/AIDS and STIs along with addressing personal queries. The toll free number, 1097 is advertised in local cable television channels and has received more than 1751 calls in 2009 comprising of over 50% of female callers. Primary reason for its popularity is the provision for quality information and maintenance of anonymity of caller.





INNOVATING PUBLIC HEALTH OUTREACH

In cities and towns (both rural and urban) barbers can be trained into effective mediums of educating and informing people. We have through our Barber Intervention Program trained them as hubs of information dissemination about health, HIV/AIDS and condom distribution and also to prevent infection due to bad hygiene practices.

Over 1700 barbers trained by us are reaching approximately 10,000 customers directly in Patna, Vaishali, Bhojpur and Jahanabad in Bihar through this program.

Over 10,000 barbers were reached in last 3 years through successful implementation of the program in 24 states

Program impact:

- Approximately 140,000 Condoms were distributed through our trained barbers.
- Over 10,000 clients educated on condom use and benefits.
- 24 HIV cases detected and referred for HIV counselling through Barbers
- 31 cases identified with symptoms of STI and referred to appropriate centre/clinic for help through barbers.











ADVOCACY FOR PREVENTION

Workplace Intervention Programme aims at reducing the risk of transmission of STIs/HIV /AIDS among the migrant labourers and their family members by enhancing access to knowledge and information on relevant issues at their work place.

In 2009 FXB Suraksha reached out to 2900 workers at Polavaram Project in Andhra Pradesh, Godavari in Maharashtra, Elevated Highway Project at Badarpur in Delhi, Chamera Hydroelectric Project at Chamba in Himachal Pradesh and Lucknow Highway Project in Uttar Pradesh.

Approximately 18000 workers have been reached in past three years by work place intervention programmes across India.

VOLUNTARY COUNSELLING CENTER WITH STI CLINIC

FXB Suraksha has been successfully running counselling centres at Kerala and Maharashtra, reaching out to over 1800 vulnerable individuals and 500 PLHAs. It serves as a gateway for both HIV prevention and early access to its treatment, care and support.



Research Initiatives

Rapid assessment survey was conducted on Migrant Population in Noida to initiate a Community Based Program for the underserved community.

External evaluation of FXB-Village Programs was initiated in the State of Medinipur (West Bengal), Dhapa (West Bengal), Manipur & Mizoram to evaluate the performance of ongoing programmes in operation since 2008.

Study on public health programming in Rajasthan and West Bengal: A MPH Candidate from Harvard School of Public Health spent one month as an intern at FXB Suraksha in December, 2009. His report on 'Field experience in health and human rights' was an outcome of his study on public health programming in our projects in Rajasthan and West Bengal.

Study on Income generating Activities in FXB-Village, Dhapa: A MBA student from IBS, Hyderabad spent two months as an intern at FXB Suraksha Kolkata office in January, 2010. He studied the methods for strengthening of various income generating activities undertaken by beneficiaries in FXB-Village of Dhapa-Dhipi.

Story of Change: A Second Life

AIDS took away Rahul's parents and at a tender age of four it was assumed that he will eventually die too. The young child scarcely received any care, love or attention from his grandparents. He was assigned a deathbed... even before his death.

Rahul was identified by FXB Suraksha staff in their field visits. On running tests, TB infection along with HIV was identified. The ailing child was taken under immediate medical treatment and was put on ART. The big challenge faced by Rahul was not to fight the infection but the discriminatory attitude of his immediate family. FXB Suraksha provided counselling to his grandmother and made her realise that Rahul had his whole life ahead of him, if her attitude didn't kill him first.

Today a positive outlook and proper timely care has given Rahul a chance to lead a new life... A second life





TALKING CHANGE - MAKING DIFFERENCE



World AIDS Orphans Day: 3000 children participated in a national Painting Competition organised under the theme 'My Dream' and painted their vision of the world. The year was marked as the 20th anniversary of the Convention of Child Rights and FXB Suraksha's work for children. 68 national and regional newspapers, 26 TV and radio stations and 22 web portals covered the event.



Airtel Delhi Half Marathon 2009: FXB Suraksha won the FIRST prize for the Best Sensational Squad with a theme in the Airtel Delhi Half Marathon along with Ishara Puppet Theatre Trust. The 35 runners representing us campaigned for the cause of children affected by AIDS and poverty. The theme was 'Hopes Alive – There is life beyond HIV/AIDS – Join us to make it a reality'. The Squad was covered live on five national news channels – CNBC- TV 18, Aaj Tak, Sahara Samay, and Doordarshan.




Documentary Film - "Keeping Hopes Alive": The film was based on the FXB-Village in Medinipur, West Bengal in partnership with Areva Foundation. It encapsulates the impact of our interventions made in the last two years and how it helped beneficiaries in keeping their hopes alive. The film was released both in English and French.

Direct Mail Campaign: FXB Suraksha conducted a Direct Mail Campaign for 3000 individuals (warm contacts) in December 2009. The direct mail pack contained an appeal letter, response coupon, business reply envelope and a blank greeting card which the receiver could use to send to friends and relatives. This was a brand building exercise and also served as a base to reinforce the cause for which FXB Suraksha works in India.

We will continue to advocate for the rights of orphan and vulnerable children particularly those affected and infected with HIV/AIDS. We will fight against the stigma and discrimination faced by such children and women.




