In partnership with Plan India, FXBIS has entered into an MOU with the DM Office of Gautam Budh Nagar district (UP) to work with students of 9 government schools on issues of personal health and sanitation.

Two very remote villages of rural Assam will now be lit throughout the nights after FXBIS state team installed 10 and 20 solar street lights in Dahinagaon and Khataniapara villages of district Darrang. There was no light prior to this installation. What can be better for the women, old and children of 1645 odd families than to have a safer environment to move around in? FXBIS' humble attempts at targeting the "forgotten issues of forgotten people in forgotten places" (Albina du Boisrouvray).



FXBIS fights human trafficking with MUKTI

FXBIS, since inception, has endeavoured for a safe secure environment for the young at its intervention locations. One such place is the Ukhrul district of Manipur, considered a major source state for human trafficking in India. FXBIS' anti-trafficking programme, MUKTI has chosen to specifically raise awareness among school adolescents on issues of child trafficking and child sexual abuse. The sessions are centered around prevention of any form of child exploitation and the steps a young could take when trapped in a perilous situation. With support from Ecpat Luxembourg, FXBIS has facilitated formation of 27 school adolescent clubs in 25 schools of Ukhrul, bringing encouraging responses from parents, teachers and the students themselves.

Nurturing Young Minds

FXBIS engages with children and adolescents in diverse ways: life-skills' training, facilitating adolescent school clubs, awareness & sensitisation workshops on child sexual abuse, child exploitation and human trafficking, basic hygiene practises, addressing nutrition deficiencies and encouraging community peer educators especially in rural areas and urban slums. Diverse interventions with only one objective - nurture and empower the young to make them sensible and strong adults. Start early to lay a strong foundation.

Co-creating with communities

Wisdom proclaims a social issue is best tackled when nipped in the bud. On human trafficking (HT) and child sexual abuse, FXBIS' strategy has been to use the four pronged approach of rescue, rehabilitate (victims), sensitise and train (stakeholders). Awareness building and sensitisation is priority if we are aiming at nipping the social malaise in its bud.
